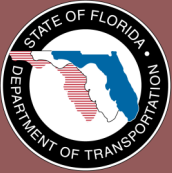

The USDOT Transportation Safety Institute's *Transit Bus System Safety (FT00533)* is a 4½-day class. The training will be held on May 14-18, 2012 from 8:00 am-4:30 pm Monday-Thursday and 8:00 am-Noon on Friday in Tampa, Florida. A registration form is required to attend the course.

COURSE OVERVIEW

This course presents a formalized, standardized approach to bus system safety concepts and program plans. Participants will receive instruction and guidance in developing and implementing a transit bus System Safety Program Plan which is critical to bus system safety.

Participants will learn the use of best practices in prevention of passenger incidents and vehicle collisions; how to select vehicle and facility design, operation security, and technology selection and maintenance. Identify behavioral safety concepts, as well as safety awareness and management; analyze collision tracking data and/or hazard analysis, including the solution to some of those problems.

- Core system safety elements; enhanced system safety elements suggested by the FTA
- Safety climate and the impact on safety performance
- Consequences of accidents and incidents
- Heinrich Ratio
- System safety; System safety as a management discipline
- System Safety Program Plan (SSPP) content requirements
- Vehicles, facilities equipment and systems
- Human Resources
- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- Threat and vulnerability analyses
- Pre-test, quiz, final exam

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

SSPP developers, transit executive managers, risk managers, bus transit safety managers, maintenance managers, Human Resource managers, safety supervisors, facility managers, SSPP implementers and administrators

HOW TO REGISTER

There is a \$110 materials fee that will be paid by FDOT's Florida Statewide Transit Training and Technical Assistant Program for the first 12 registrants who are currently employed by a Florida public transportation agency. Once these 12 seats are filled, you may register directly through TSI at www.tsi.dot.gov, but will have to pay the \$110 registration fee.
